<b>0003 - New Orleans, Louisiana 1969</b> – Men waiting for Alcide ‘Slowdrag’ Pavageau’s Jazz Funeral.
<b>0004 - New Orleans, Louisiana 1969</b> – The Second Line at Pavageau’s jazz funeral.
<b>0005 - New Orleans, Louisiana 1969</b> – The Second Line at Pavageau’s jazz funeral. The umbrellas were not used for rain or sun, but were a symbol mimicking the whites who used parasols to avoid sun.
<b>0006 - New Orleans, Louisiana 1969</b> – St. Louis Cemetery during Pavageau’s jazz funeral.
<b>0008 - New Orleans, Louisiana 1969</b> – Tuba player walking home from a jazz funeral.
<b>0011 - Vancouver, B. C., Canada 1973</b> – Exhibition Park Horse Race Track.
<b>0012 - Lafayette, Louisiana 1973</b> – A Cajun Couple at Evangeline Downs Horse Race Track.
<b>0013 - Lafayette, Louisiana 1973</b> – Cajun jockeys at Evangeline Downs Horse Race Track. Eddie Delahoussaye (standing), one of the most famous jockeys of all time. Cecil Borel (seated), the brother of Calvin Borel, another famous jockey.
<b>0019 - Paris, France 1972</b> – Longchamps Horse Race Course during the running of the annual Prix de l’Arc de Triomphe race.
<b>0026 - Abbeville, Louisiana 1971</b> – My brother Ronald and his wife Alexis at their wedding with Lucy the cow.
<b>0032 - New York, New York 1965</b> – Artisan displaying his work at the semi-annual Washington Square Art Show in Greenwich Village.
<b>0034 - Siem Reap Province, Cambodia 1967</b> – Woman on a boat on the Tonlé Sap (Lake). Most of the local people on the Tonlé Sap live in floating houses in the Siem Reap River.
<b>0035 - Santa Barbara de Yoro, Honduras 1968</b> – Children watching photographer while photographing other members of the family in their home.
<b>0037 - Atlántida Department, Honduras 1968</b> – Pineapple field worker. Photographed for the Standard Fruit Company.
<b>0038 - Matamoros, Mexico 1971</b> – Woman with Raquel Welch poster. Photographed while on assignment for Time Magazine’s annual Good Samaritans issue at the end of the year.
<b>0040 - Catalonia, Spain 1973</b> – Old man reading a book while sitting in the warm winter sunlight.
<b>0057 - Minneapolis, Minnesota 1969</b> – Storefront reflections in downtown.
<b>0064 - New Orleans, Louisiana 1970</b> – One of the floats in the annual King Rex Mardi Gras Parade. Photographed while on assignment for The New York Times.
<b>0078 - Barcelona, Catalonia, Spain 1973</b> – Scene at the bird market on the central Ramblas.
<b>0123 - New York, New York 1990</b> – This photo was taken on the Rockefeller Center Promenade as part of a series of photographs of tourists in different locations.
<b>0127 - Saigon, Vietnam 1966</b> – Boat families on the Saigon River. These families live on their boats which move cargo from the large ships on the river to the docks along the shore.
<b>0131 - Da Nang, Vietnam 1966</b> – Fisherman on his boat in the harbor. Many of the fishermen have deformed toes caused by a lifetime of using their toes to hold down ropes on their boats.
<b>0145 - Da Nang, Vietnam 1967</b> – Siblings in the burn ward at Da Nang Children’s Hospital. This hospital was primarily used for Napalm burn victims.
<b>0158 - La Ceiba, Honduras 1968</b> – Brother and sister at a school organized by Peace Corp members.
<b>0162 - Puerto Lempira, Gracias a Dios, Honduras 1968</b> – Miskito native boys in school.
<b>0217 - New Orleans, Louisiana 1970</b> – A member of the Mardi Gras Indians performing at Jazzfest.
<b>0225 - Calumet, Louisiana 1968</b> – During the rescue operations at the Belle Isle salt mine disaster in which twenty-one of the miners died. These women had been waiting at the Calumet Landing, several miles from the mine, for news. This photo was taken just after they were told the miners had been found dead. Photographed on assignment for Life Magazine.
<b>0227 - Puerto Lempira, Gracias a Dios, Honduras 1968</b> – Miskito native girl building a doll house.
<b>0240 - St. Martinsville, Louisiana 1973</b> – Woman sitting in a pickup truck during the July 4th celebrations in Evangeline State Park.
<b>0275 - New York, New York 1965</b> – Vendor at the Avenue “C” market, on Lower East Side.

<b>0309 - New York, New York 1965</b> – Man sleeping on a bench in Tompkins Square Park on the Lower East Side (also known as Alphabet City).
<b>0747 - New Orleans, Louisiana 1969</b> - A security guard waiting for a bus at the corner of Royal and St. Peter streets in the Vieux Carré (French Quarter).
<b>0808 - Bridgeport, Connecticut 1993</b> – Line Dancers at the Annual Blackrock Lobster Festival.
<b>1087 - New York, New York 1994</b> – Man and sculpture at the Ferzt Gallery on Prince Street in SOHO SOHO (South of Houston Street).
<b>1479 - Vientiane, Laos 1967</b> – Young vendor selling vegetables at the Central Market.
<b>1832 - Carville, Louisiana 1968</b> – Andrew Ory a blind patient at the U.S. Public Health Service hospital for leprosy (Hansens disease). He had been hospitalized since he was a teenager.
